“While you are waiting, God is working.”



Waiting...for most of us, is one of the most difficult tasks in this life. There are many difficult tasks, but Waiting is high on the list. Waiting at an airport is one of the most irritating, challenging, and trying. I am here to confess that this is an area where I really struggle.

In November 2024, Pastor and I were headed to the airport in Manila, Philippines, where we were scheduled to depart around 9:30 pm. We had been instructed by our travel agent – of whom we determined later, had most likely never traveled – that we would need to be at the airport some 4 hours ahead of departure in order to get through customs, etc. And so, the

Camachos dropped us off at the airport at 5 pm. As we moved inside with our luggage, we discovered no check-in counter had any information on our departure. Not one! In fact, half of the airport was owned and operated by Philippine Air, the other half was divided between all other airlines. This was irritating. My husband asked a security person, who informed us that we would have to wait until 2-3 hours before departure for check-in. This was challenging. To top it all off, there was limited seating, which meant we had to stand for the next 2 hours and wait for the counter to open. At that point, we would get in line, check-in, pass through security and customs, walk to the proper concourse and gate – hoping we would get there on time. This was trying as well as annoying, confusing, and frustrating. Waiting is Burdensome.

For us as Believers, Waiting on God can be burdensome at times. Only He sees the Big Picture. Waiting on Him is an Exercise for our Faith. It is irritating, challenging, trying, annoying, and frustrating. We just plain don't like it. Might as well admit it.

A Characteristic of Living the Simple Life is Waiting...Waiting Patiently to be exact. Actually, it is another Command to be Obeyed.
